

Parks as social spaces

Youth work in parks is part of Vienna's open child and youth work practice and is based on professional guidelines for social work in public space*.

Using methods of socio-cultural animation and of play, outdoor and leisure education, the programme offers children and young people a wide variety of non-formal and informal learning opportunities in selected Viennese parks.

Moreover, park-based youth work provides children and young people with opportunities to establish relationships with others and it increases their scope of action by involving them in participation projects. It also encourages children and young people to identify with and appropriate their neighbourhoods. In this way, park-based youth work makes a significant contribution towards preserving and further developing public space as a space of appropriation and education for children and young people.



What is park-based youth work?

Wiener Parkbetreuung, Vienna's park-based youth work programme, was established in 1993. It is a free leisure time programme designed primarily for children from 6 to 13 years. Several Viennese districts also offer activities for teenagers.

Trained youth workers visit parks, school grounds, youth sports grounds and housing estates at fixed hours several times a week.

The offer is designed to reflect the interests, needs and living environments of children and young people. In line with the programme's approach of promoting participation, the individual activities are developed together with the young participants.

Activities are focussed on providing opportunities for creativity, fun, play and movement. In this way, the programme promotes children's social learning and their emotional, cognitive and motor skills.

The Youth Office of the City of Vienna's Department for Education and Youth is responsible for the coordination and professional support of the programme, which goes unrivalled in Europe.



Professional offer at district level

Park-based youth work is carried out by non-profit associations specialising in working with children and young people.

Staff members are trained educators who ensure that their work meets professional standards outlined for example in the "Grundkonzept Wiener Parkbetreuung", a basic concept for park-based youth work in Vienna. Park-based youth work builds on networking and social space orientation to promote good relationships and interactions in the neighbourhood.

The offer is funded and supported by Vienna's 23 municipal districts.
